Violet City Gym - Falkner

- Type: Flying
- Strategy: Use your starter's type advantage (Fire or Electric) or catch a Rock-type like Onix from the Ruins of Alph.
- Reward: Zephyr Badge and TM31 (Mud-Slap).

Route 36 and Goldenrod City

After defeating Falkner, travel to Route 36 and take on the Sudowoodo blocking the path using a Water-type move. Continue to Goldenrod City.

- Goldenrod City Activities:
- Visit the Goldenrod Department Store for supplies.
- Challenge the Goldenrod Gym led by Whitney.

Goldenrod Gym - Whitney

- Type: Normal
- Strategy: Prepare for her Miltank, which can use Rollout. Consider using Fighting-type Pokemon or status effects to disable her.
- Reward: Plain Badge and TM45 (Attract).

Journey Through Johto - Intermediate Gyms

After Goldenrod, your next stop is to challenge more Gyms and face new challenges.

Ecruteak City and the Burned Tower

- Explore Ecruteak and encounter the legendary Beast Trio.
- Battle Morty, the Ghost-type Gym Leader.

Ecruteak Gym - Morty

- Type: Ghost
- Strategy: Use Dark-type moves or Ghost-types of your own for an advantage.
- Reward: Fog Badge and TM30 (Shadow Ball).

Oliveine City and the Lighthouse

After Ecruteak, make your way to Oliveine City.

- Lighthouse: Help with the sick Ampharos to get access to the Gym.

Oliveine Gym - Jasmine

- Type: Steel
- Strategy: Fire and Fighting types are effective against Steel-type Pokemon.
- Reward: Mineral Badge and TM23 (Iron Tail).

Advanced Challenges and Legendary Pokemon

As you approach the latter part of your journey, several new challenges

await.

Mahogany Town and the Team Rocket Hideout

- Team Rocket: Navigate through the hideout and defeat the executives.
- Legendary Pokemon: After defeating Team Rocket, you can encounter Lugia at the Whirl Islands or Ho-Oh at the Bell Tower (if you have obtained the Rainbow Wing).

Blackthorn City and the Final Gym

- Battle Clair, the Dragon-type Gym Leader.

Blackthorn Gym - Clair

- Type: Dragon
- Strategy: Ice-type moves can be effective against her Dragon-types.
- Reward: Rising Badge and TM24 (Dragonbreath).

The Pokemon League and Elite Four

After acquiring all eight badges, it's time to head to the Pokemon League.

Victory Road

- Navigate through Victory Road, battling trainers and wild Pokemon.
- Ensure your team is well-leveled and stocked with healing items.

Elite Four Challenges

1. Will - Psychic-type. Use Dark and Bug-types to gain an advantage.
2. Koga - Poison-type. Fire and Psychic-types are effective.
3. Bruno - Fighting/Rock-type. Use Psychic and Flying-types.
4. Karen - Dark-type. Use Fighting or Bug-types to counter.
